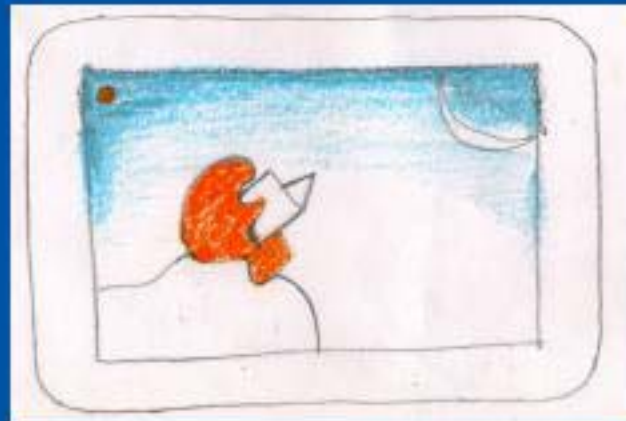
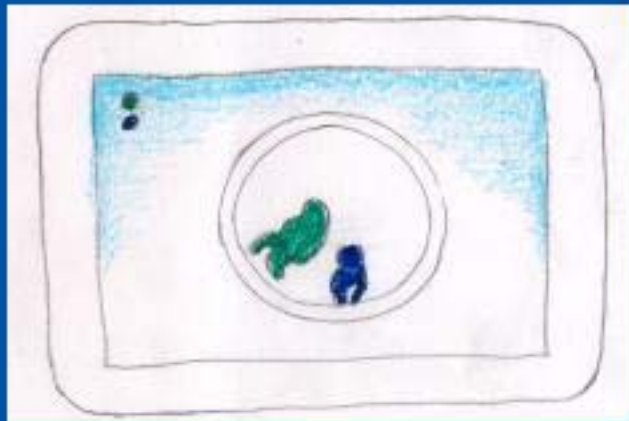
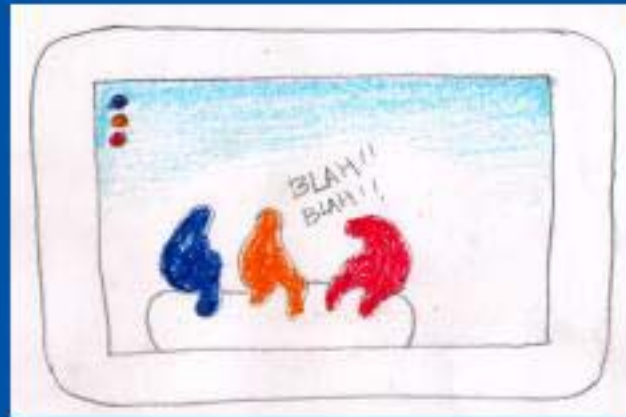
- Chess Board – a board game where players move forward

## The Banyan Tree

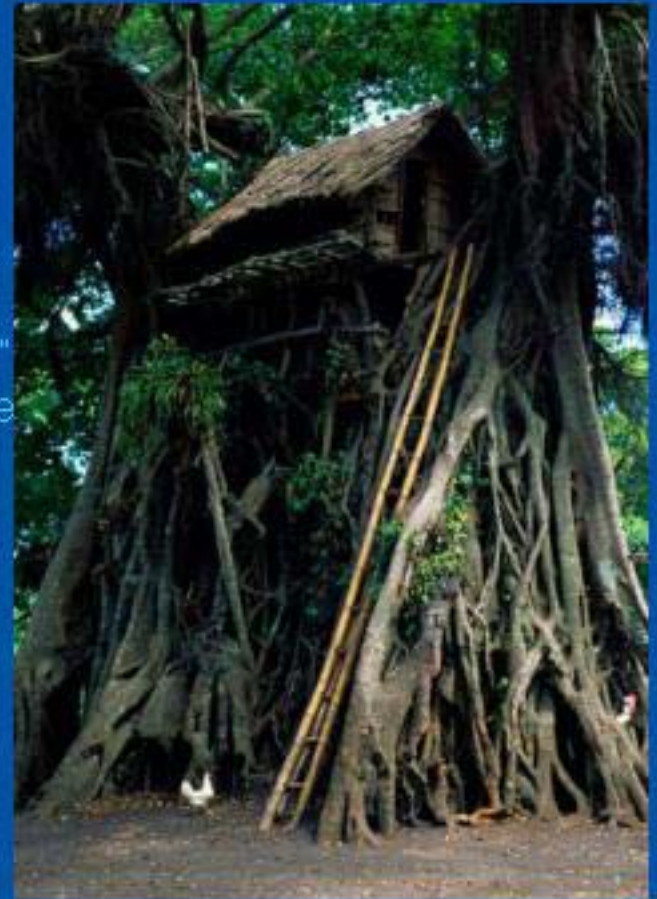
- The national tree of our country

# The Banyan Tree

## Biological description

- Belongs to the Fig tree family
- Also known as "Many footed ones" or "The tree that walks"
  - New roots grow from all its branches, pushing into the ground and forming new trunks.
- Blossoms with small yellow fruit which come in pairs
- Wood is porous
- Just one tree or if it is made up of several trees
- A small forest in itself



## ANALOGIES

### The Banyan Tree & The Elderly

- People sit under the banyan tree for its shade and serenity, we sit around the elderly when they tell us a story or when they give advice.
- Just as the wood of the banyan tree is soft and porous we revere the elderly for their experience and knowledge
- They spread their wisdom just as the banyan tree spreads around the forest
- We put forth the elderly before anything else just like we do to the banyan tree
- We build shrines at the foot of a banyan tree and so do we respect the elderly and take their blessings by touching their feet

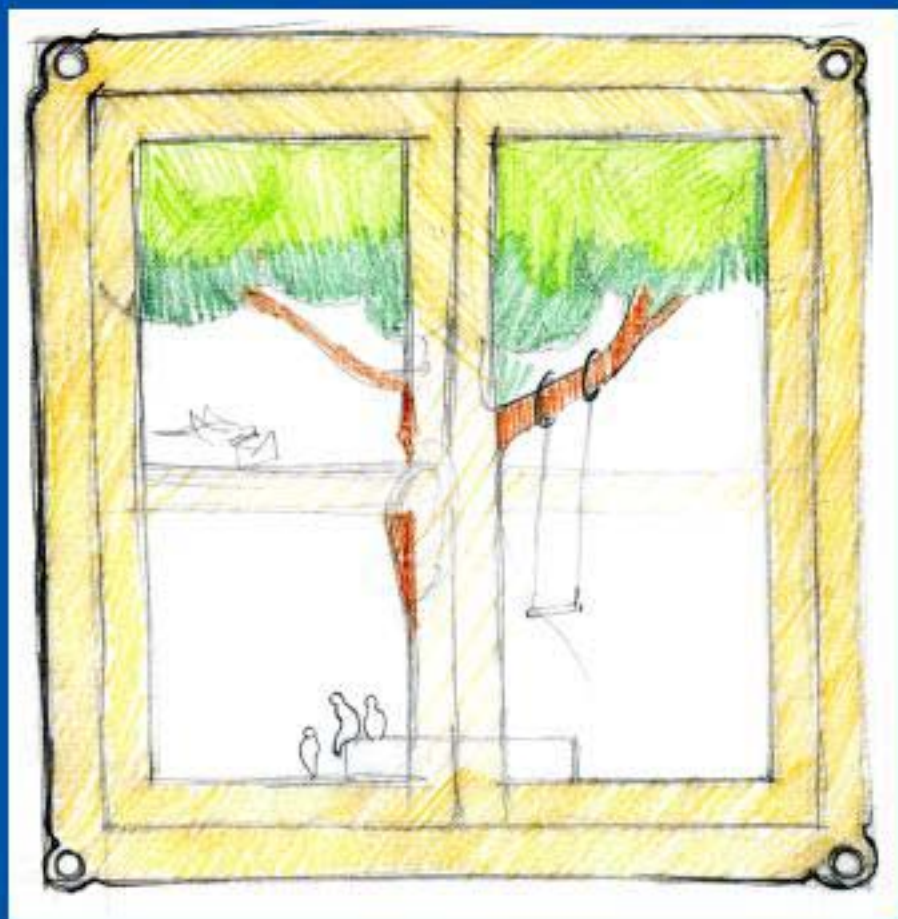

A digital window which opens into the outside world but at the same time into your personal environment which constitutes your family and friends.



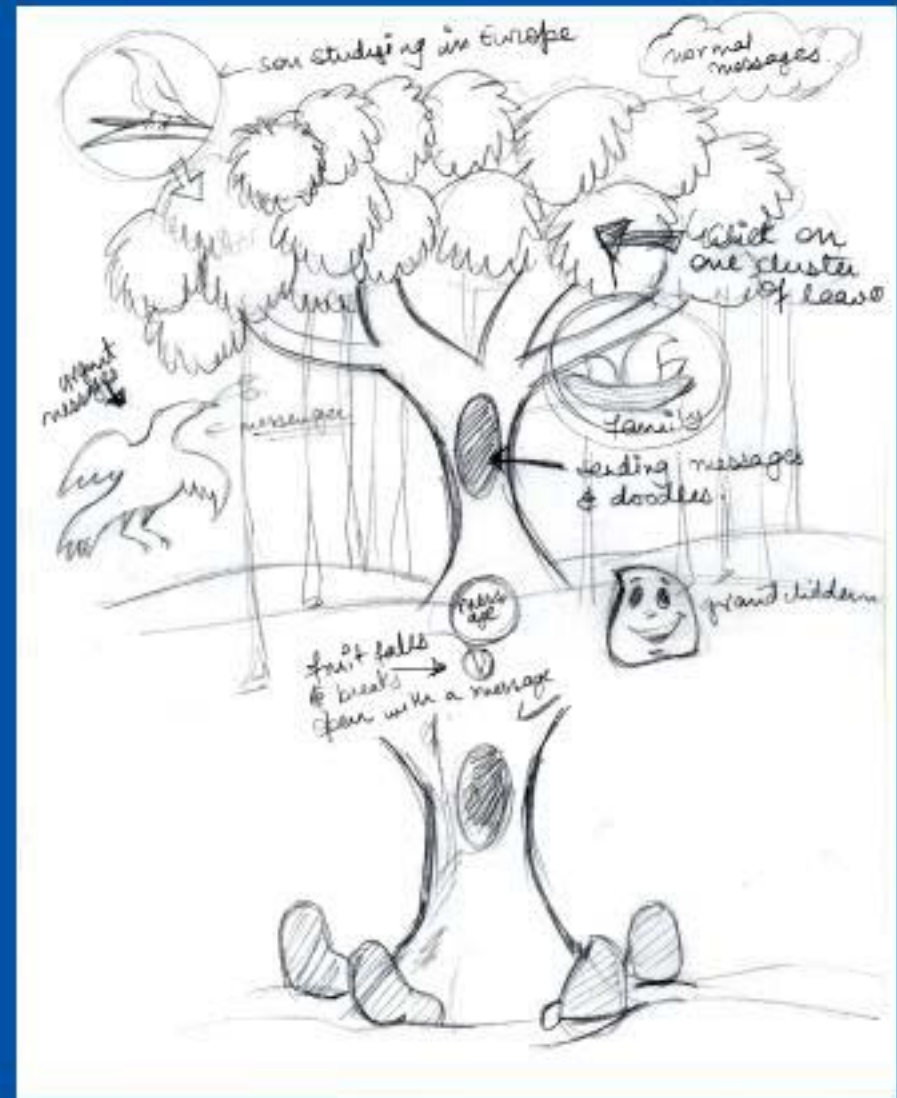

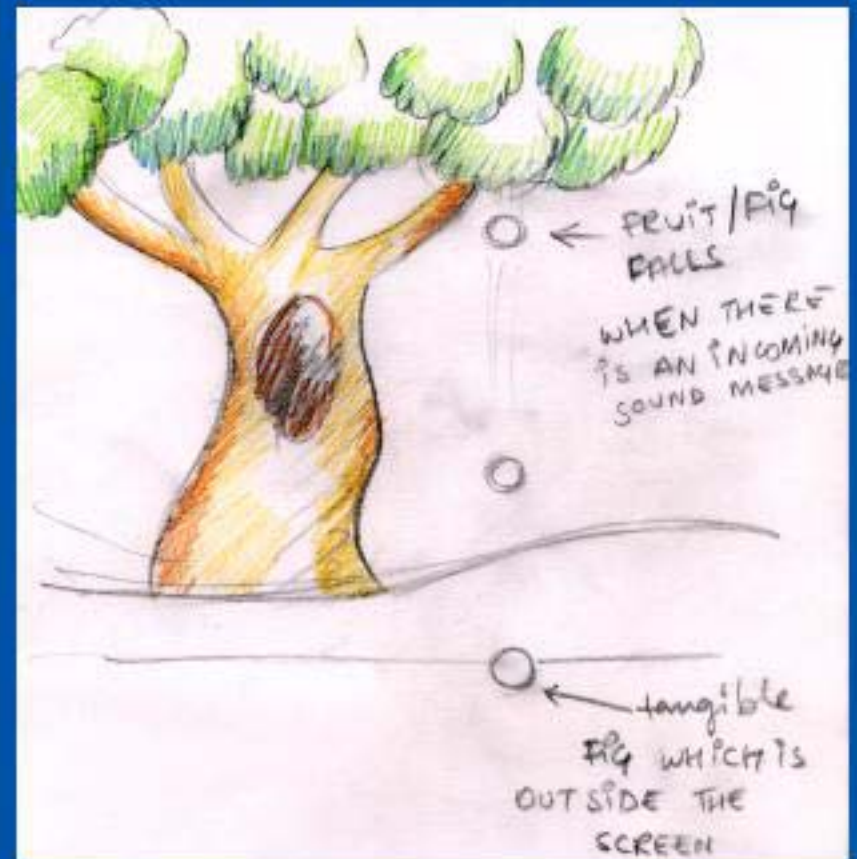
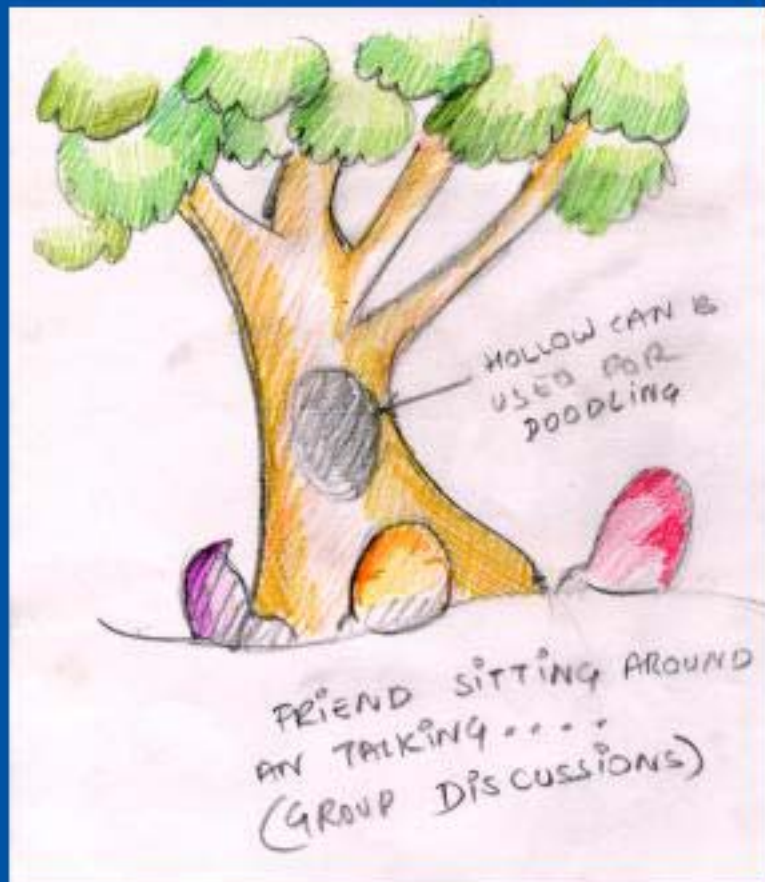
## Environment

- Cluster of leaves (each cluster represents different groups)
- Birds/clouds (messengers)
- Bee hives (storage for messages, dates etc.)
- The tree hollow is a place where u can doodle messages
- Family is represented by a nest which has abstract birds (more like blobs) for each member
- When friends join in for discussion they are represented by blobs and sit around the tree
- Messages are sent in the form of the yellow fruits that fall and break into text bubbles.
- Memo Monkey keeps store of notes & reminders



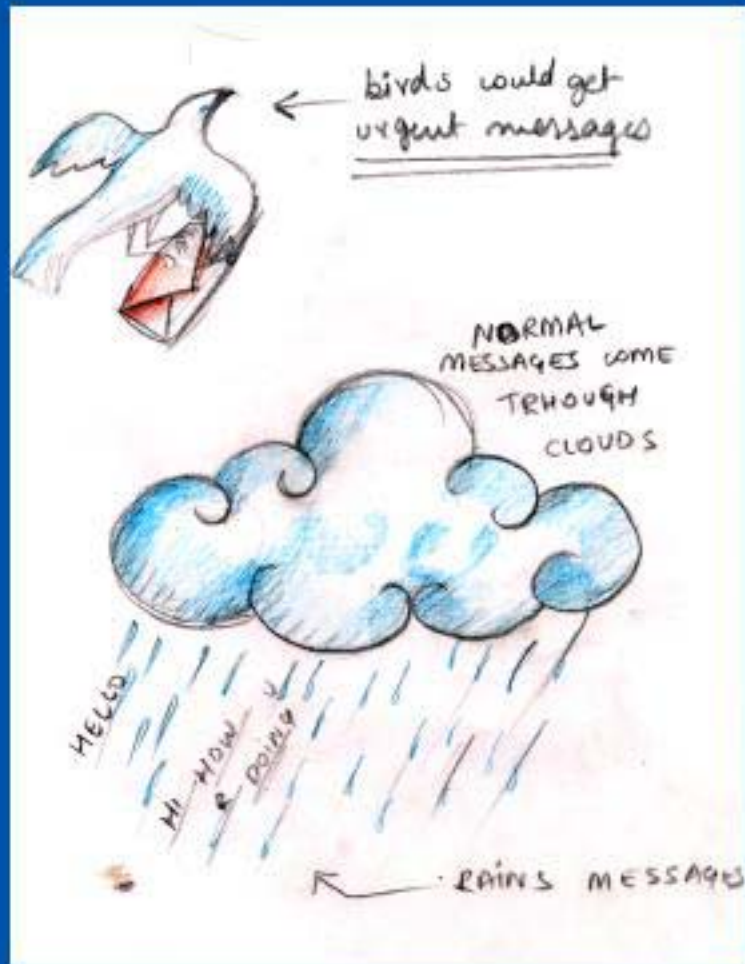

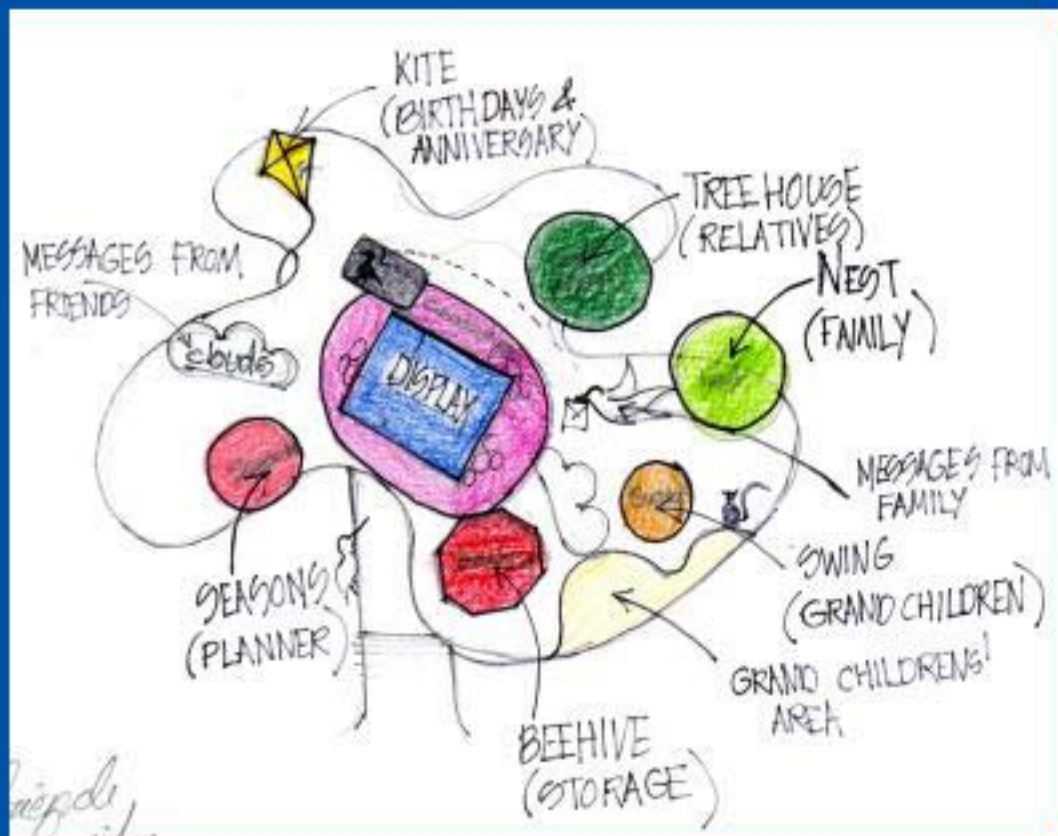
# Alternate Concepts

A table which is in the shape of a tree. The table top is an interactive area where one can access different areas of activity.

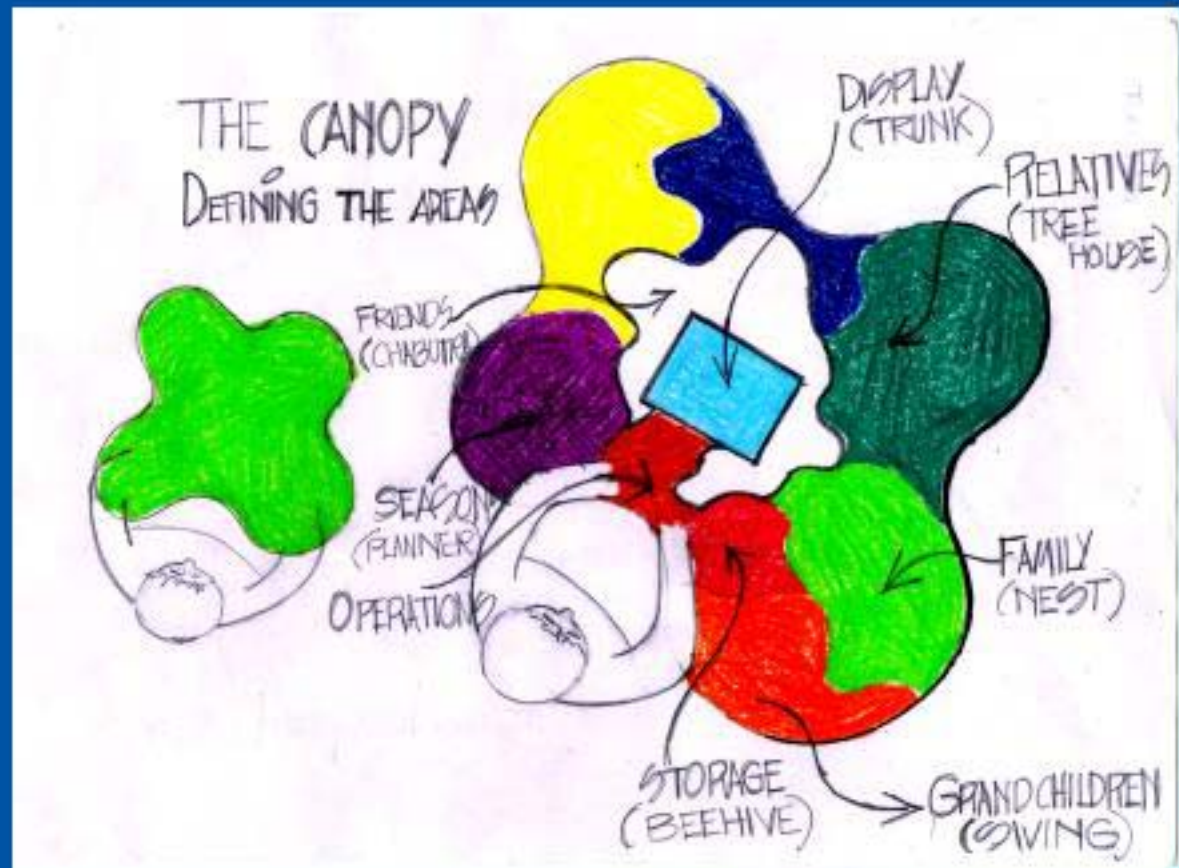
One can send messages, plan the upcoming week, and have an inventory of family, relatives and friends.

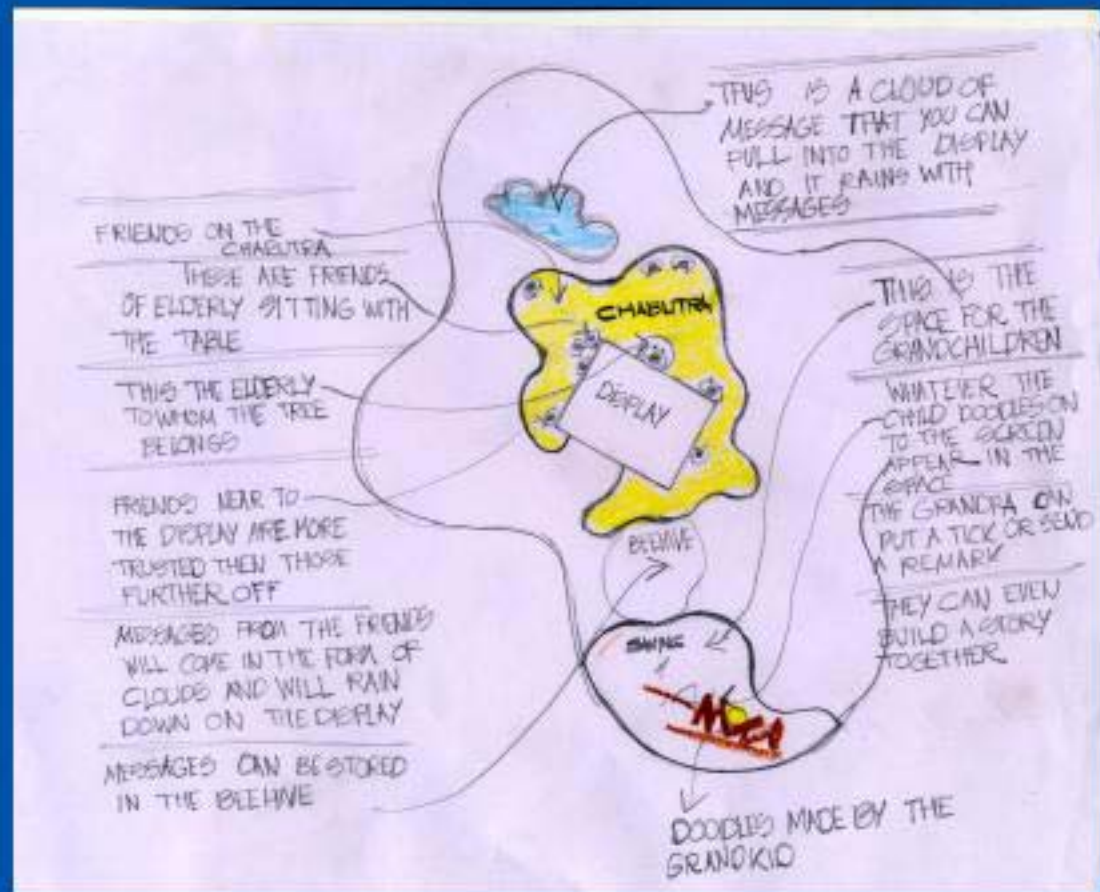

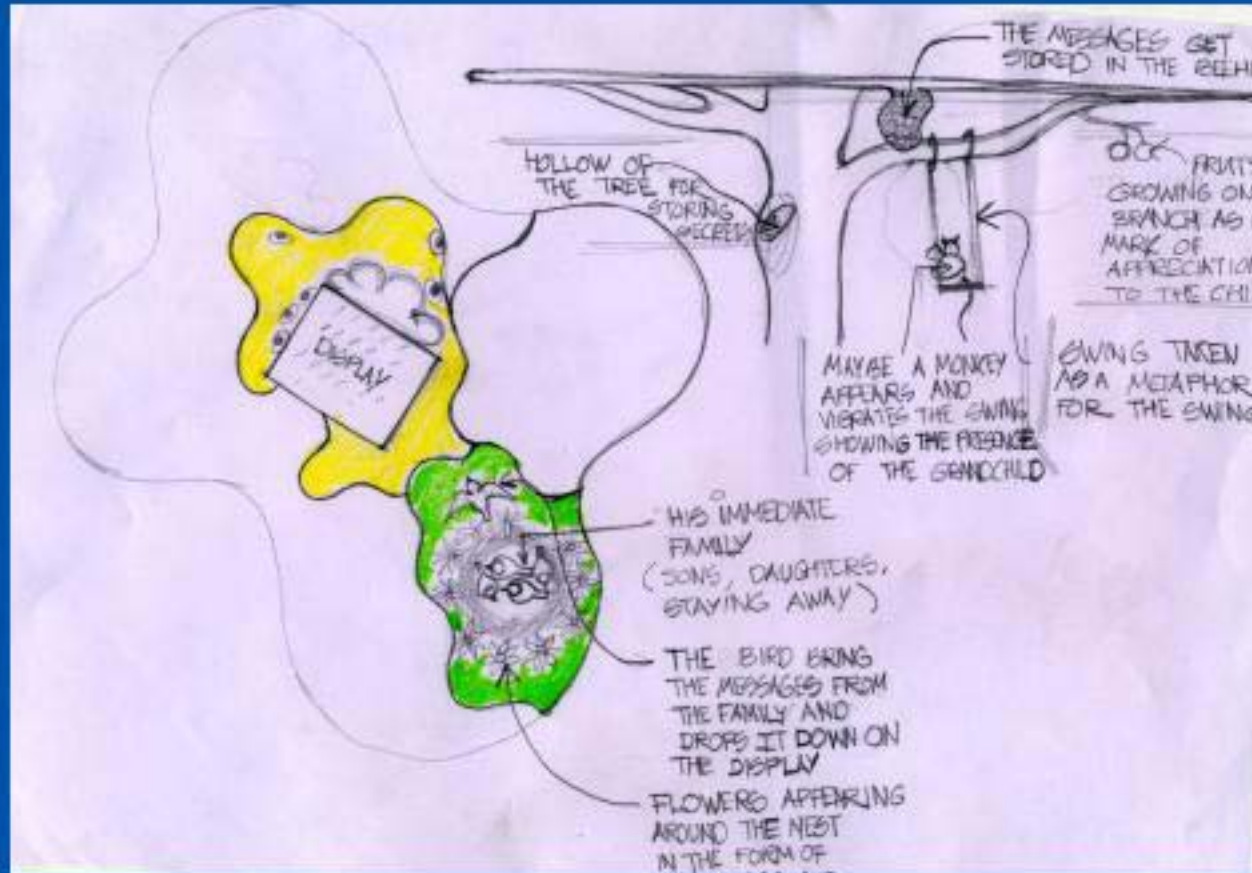

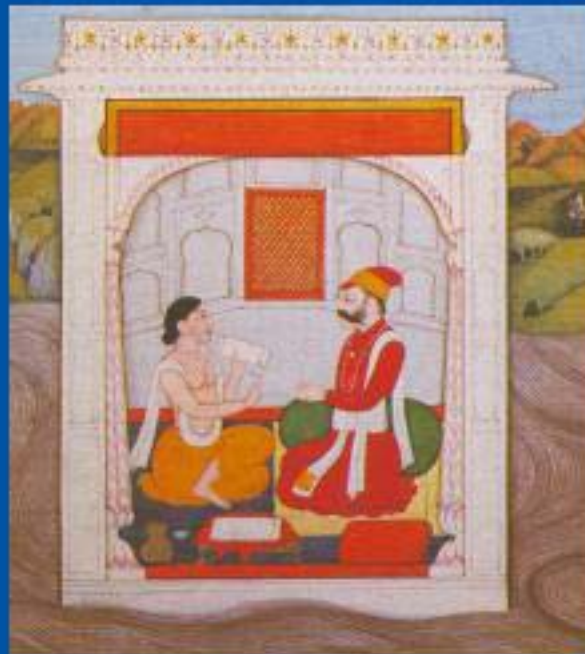

A window into the outside world



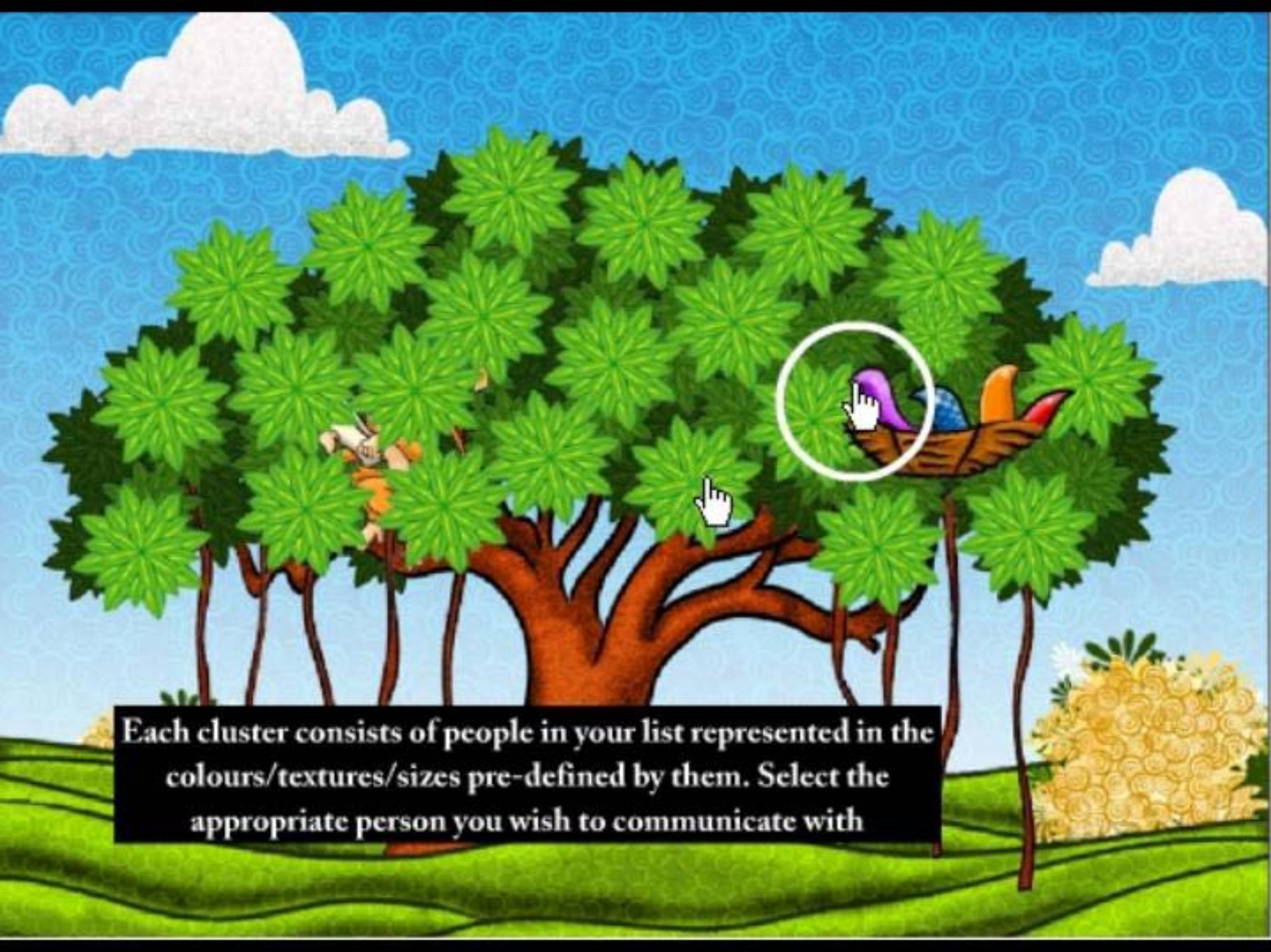
Instruction File

Please use arrow keys to go forward or back



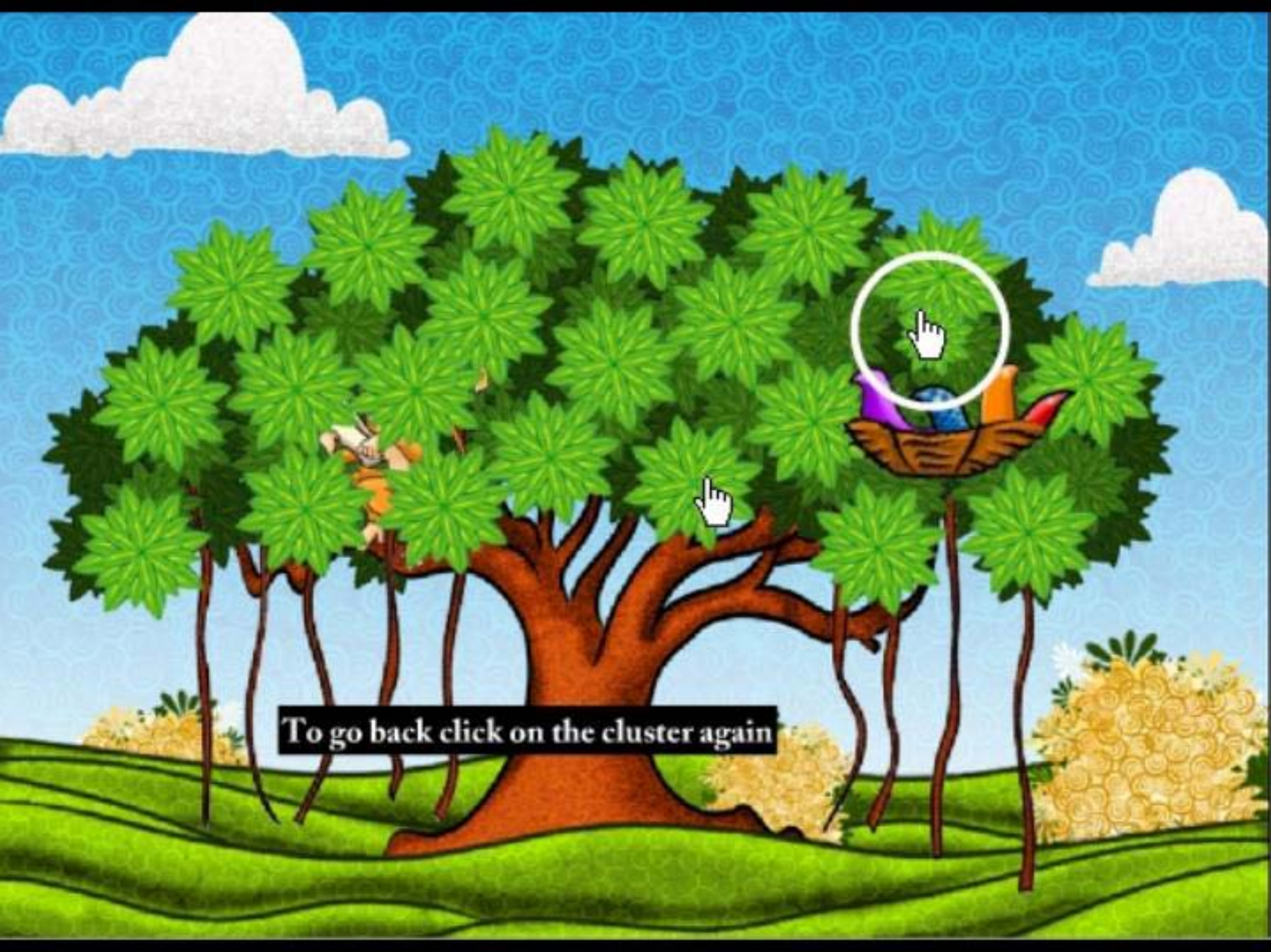


Each cluster of Light Green leaves represents a group/family

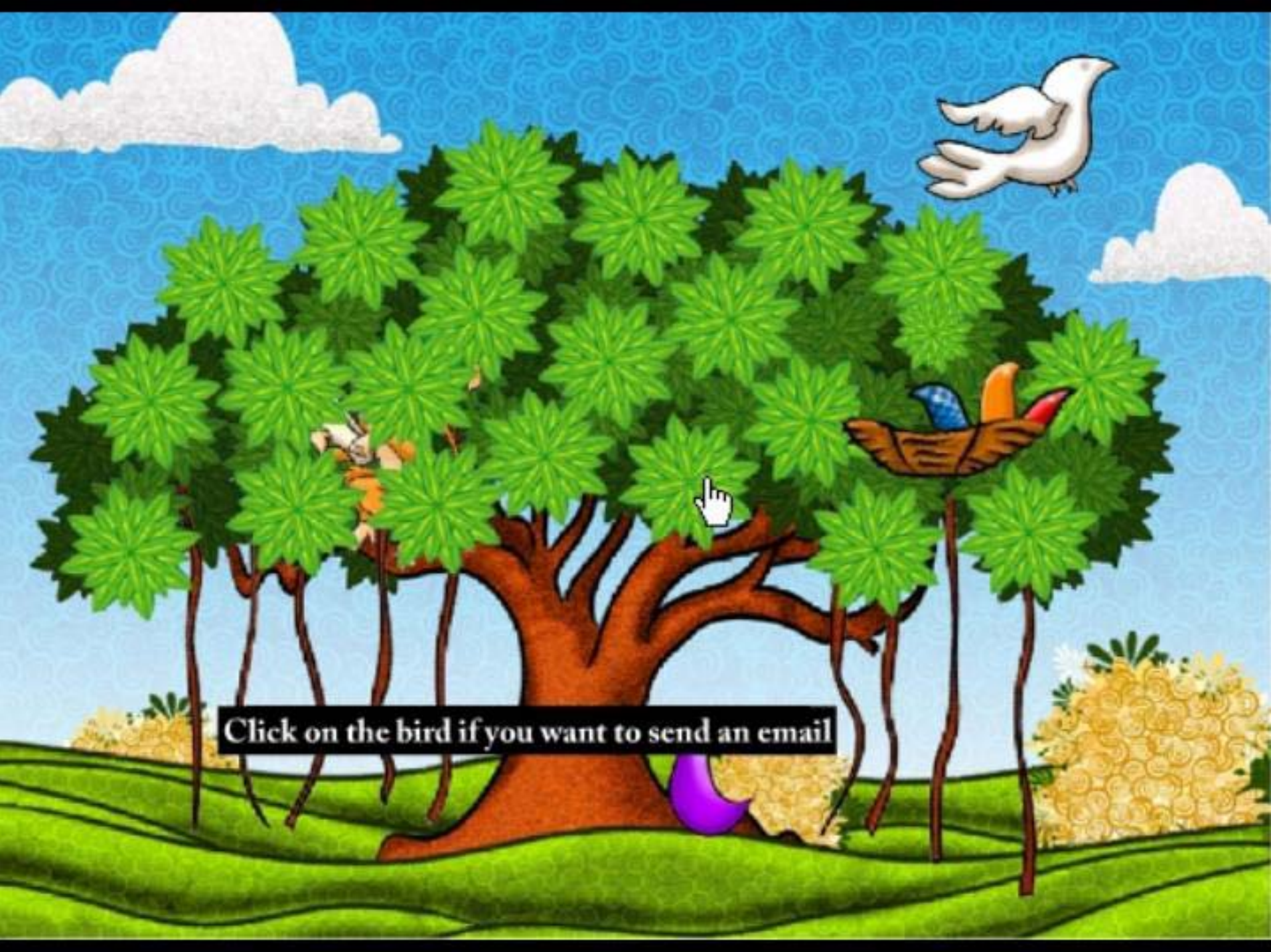

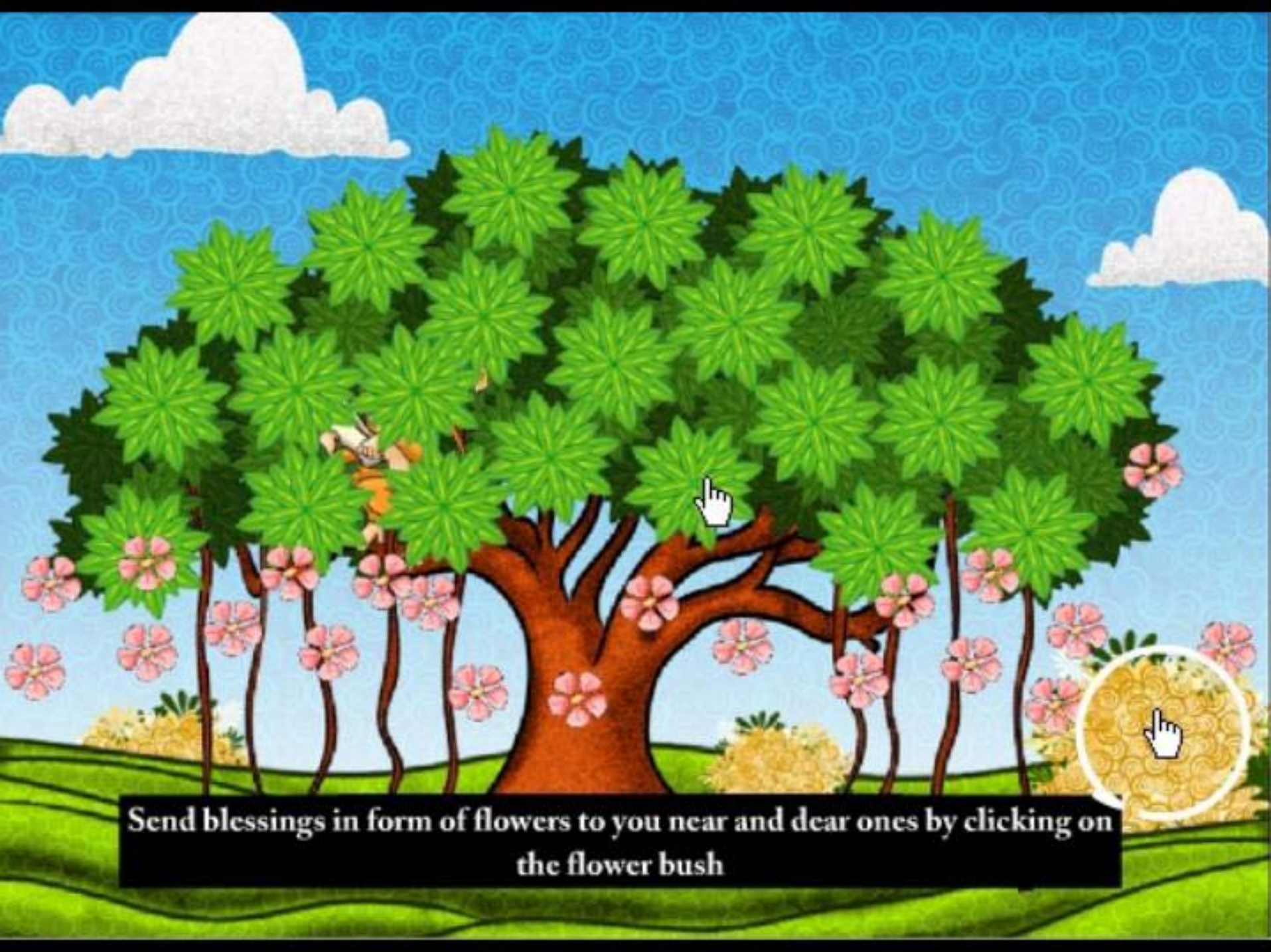
